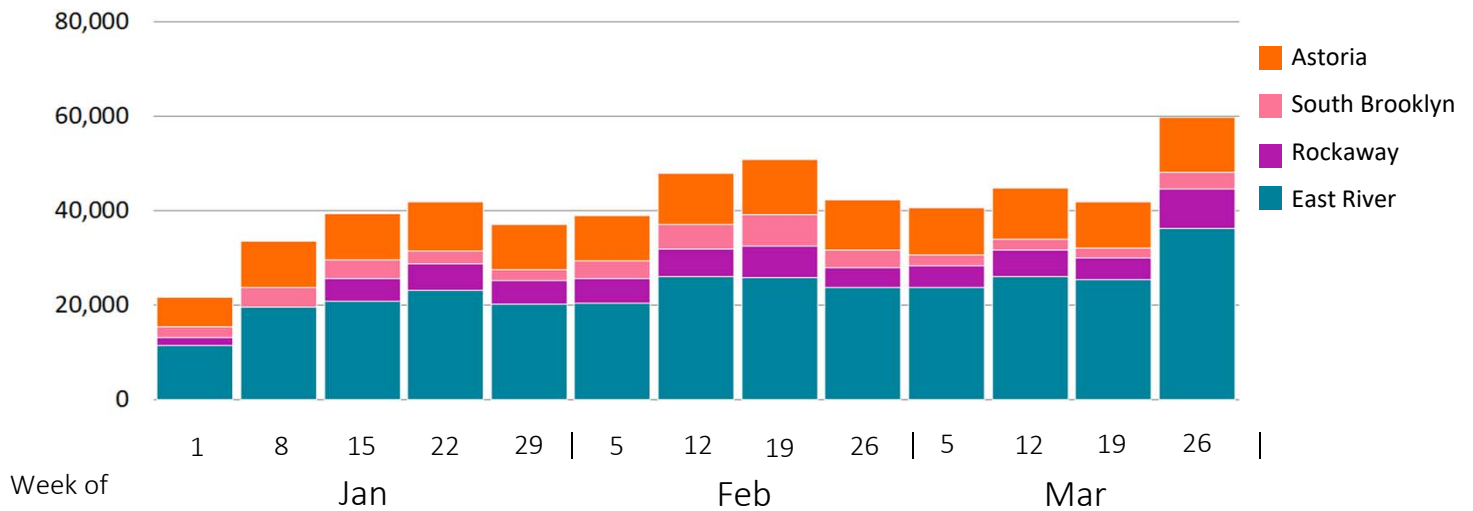

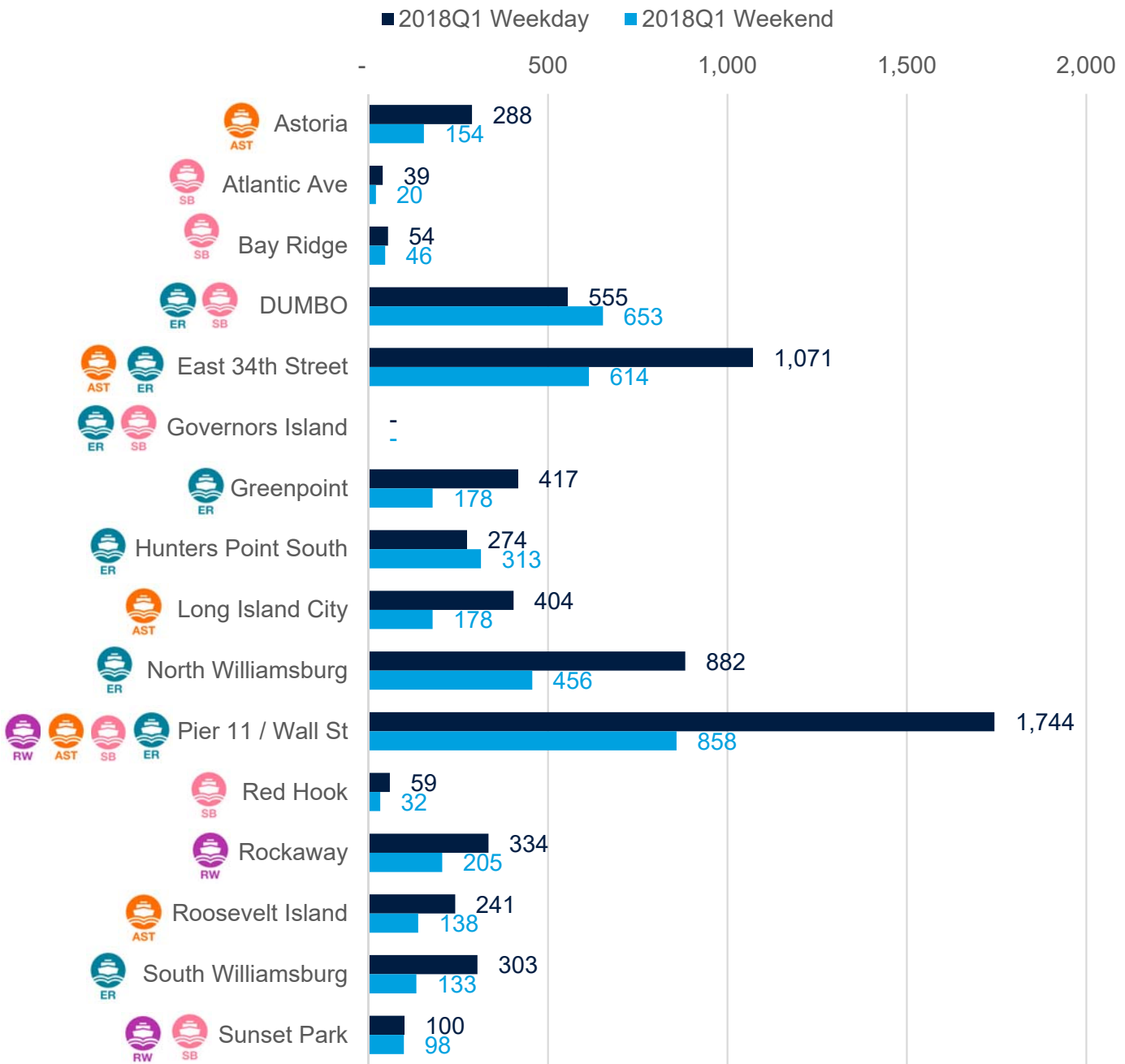

Highlights

In Q1 2018, total ridership was 541,000 passengers. Except for a cold snap in early January, winter ridership was relatively stable around 40,000 passengers per week.

Notices

January saw an accumulation of ice in Jamaica Bay and other points throughout the system which required the suspension of the Rockaway route and ice breaking in various locations in the East River and Upper Bay. Storms and days of high winds led to landing closures on the South Brooklyn and Rockaway routes.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops made within the quarter that depart no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times. This report includes delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use; NYCF Partners with other operators to charter vessels at times of high demand. ³NYCF operates to Governors Island on weekends during its public season.
