



Consistent with previous experience, seasonal ridership came down throughout October, reaching a more stable ridership base in November. This level remained consistent except for December holidays. In December, a chartered vessel in use on the Rockaway route grounded near Wall Street/Pier 11 with no injuries or discharge. Another vessel traveling on the Rockaway route grounded in December in Jamaica Bay with no injuries or discharge. Neither event had major service impact.

<sup>1</sup>On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops made within the quarter that depart no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times. This report includes delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. <sup>2</sup>Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use; NYCF Partners with other operators to charter vessels at times of high demand. <sup>3</sup>NYCF operates to Governors Island on weekends during its public season.
