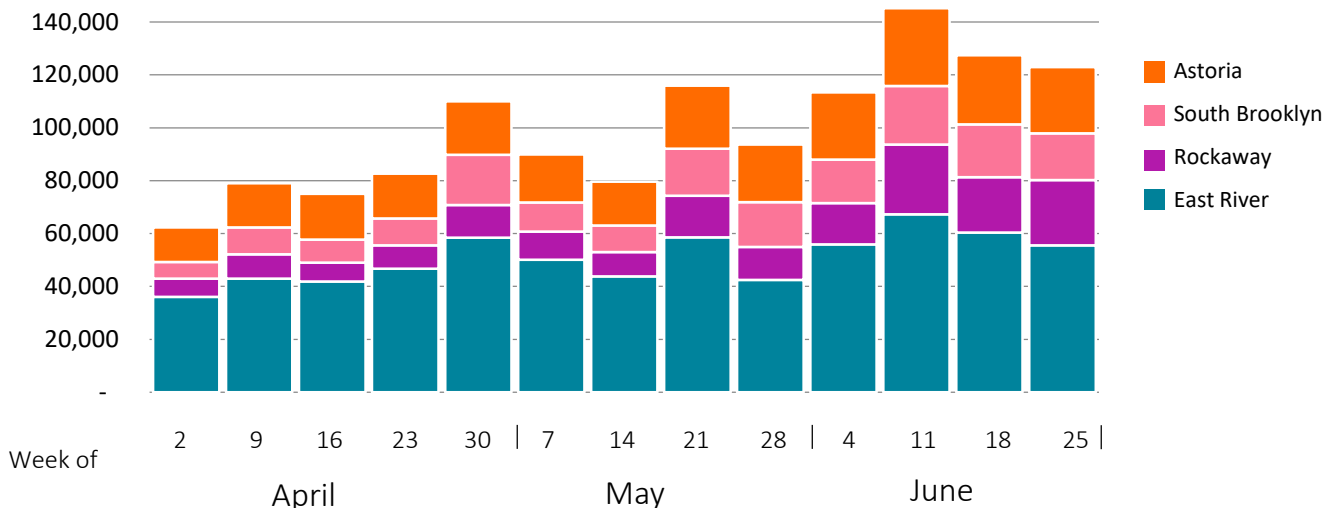

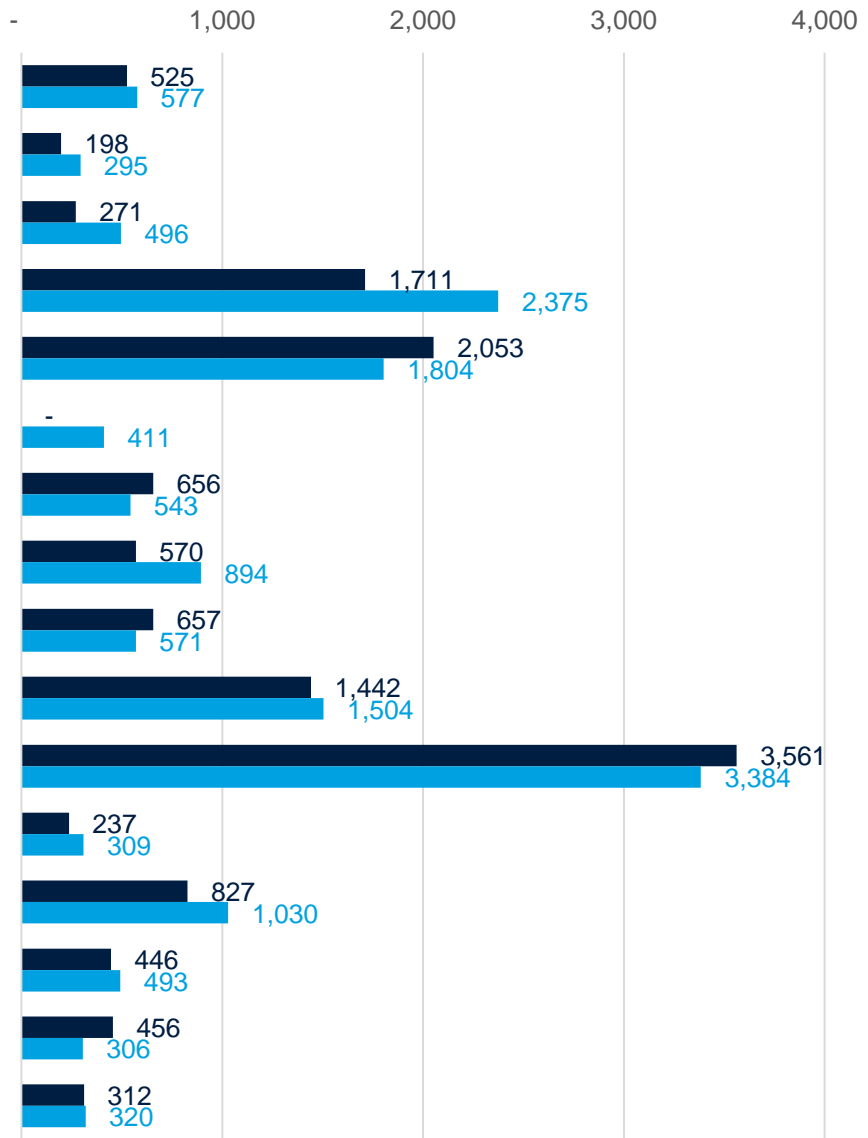

Highlights

For the first full year of service since the ER and RW routes launched on May 1, 2017, NYC Ferry carried 3.75 million riders. NYC Ferry began the 2018 summer season with four routes, notably providing more than twice as much scheduled Rockaway service as last year to handle surging demand while increasing service on the East River and other routes.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops made within the quarter that depart no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times. This report includes delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use; NYCF Partners with other operators to charter vessels at times of high demand. ³NYCF operates to Governors Island on weekends during its public season.



Service Notes

Damage at Pier 102 at Governors Island led to use of Yankee Pier for weekend shuttle service to Governors Island throughout the summer. The South Williamsburg landing was closed for required maintenance for a two week period in June.
