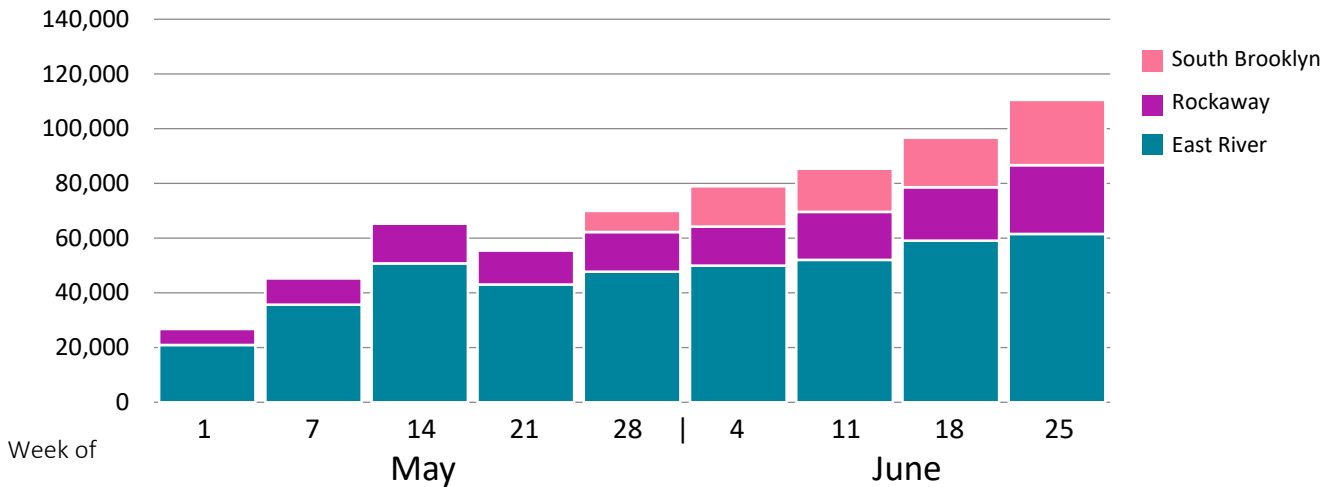

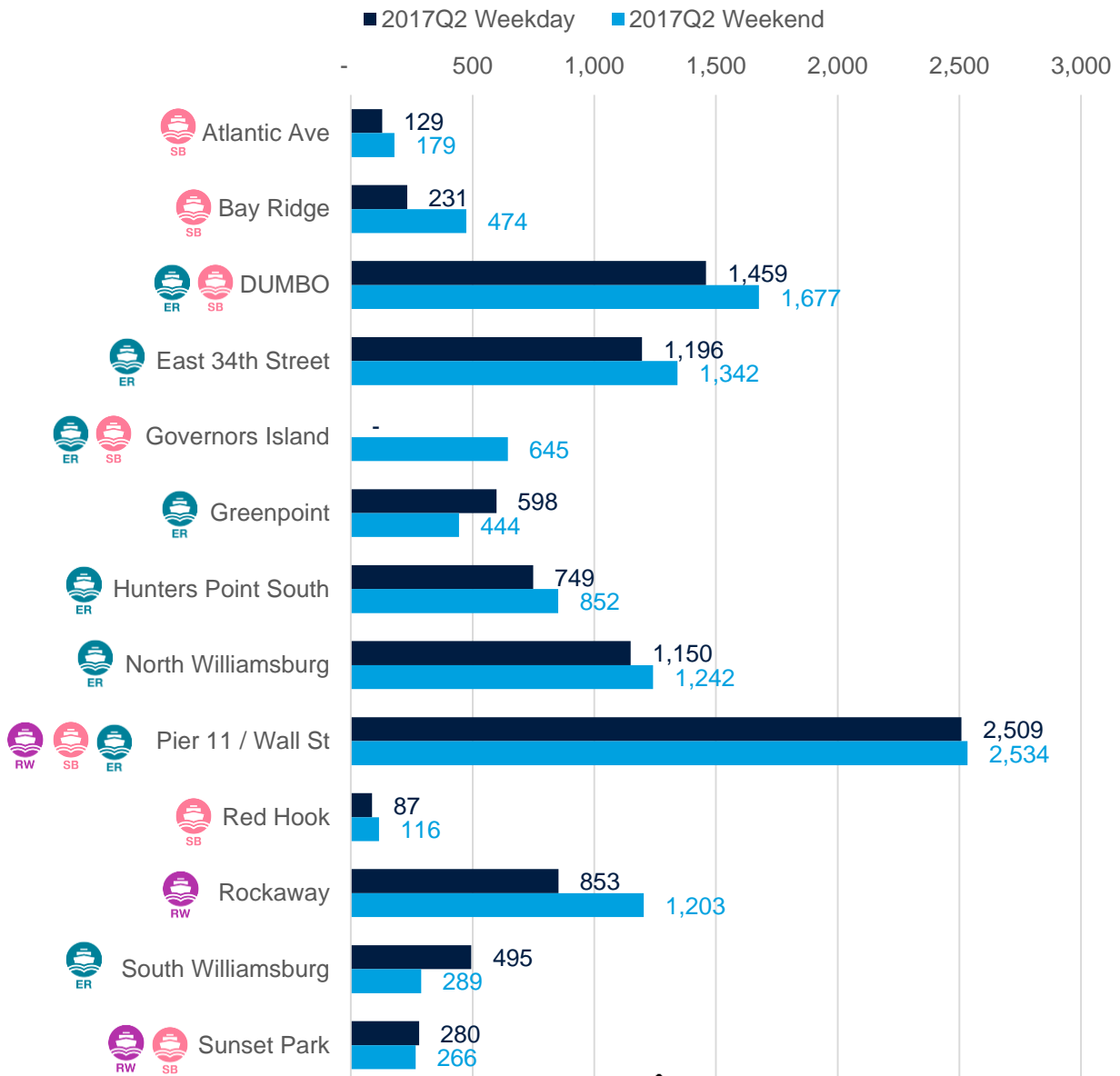

Highlights

NYC Ferry launched on May 1, 2017, with new pricing and branding for the East River Ferry and the introduction of the Rockaway route. In response to high demand on both routes, NYC Ferry operated additional trips on weekends and peak ridership days.



Notices

Tracking system for on-time performance reporting underwent start-up calibration in late June 2017; prior data is not considered reliable.

An oil spill from a Con Edison substation in May led to a slow bell along major portions of the East River route throughout early summer.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops made within the quarter that depart no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times. This report includes delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use; NYCF Partners with other operators to charter vessels at times of high demand. ³NYCF operates to Governors Island on weekends during its public season.
