




RIDERSHIP BY LANDING

NYC Ferry set a weekday ridership record on October 3rd with more than 38,000 riders. NYC Ferry set a new monthly record in October, November, and December, with more than 1.4M riders total in Q4.

NYC Ferry ran a modified schedule from 10/2-10/5 during the Sukkot Holiday. NYC Ferry operated a pointto-point shuttle between Red Hook/Atlantic Basin and Wall Street Pier 11 to accommodate a port of call at Brooklyn Cruise Terminal on 10/27.
