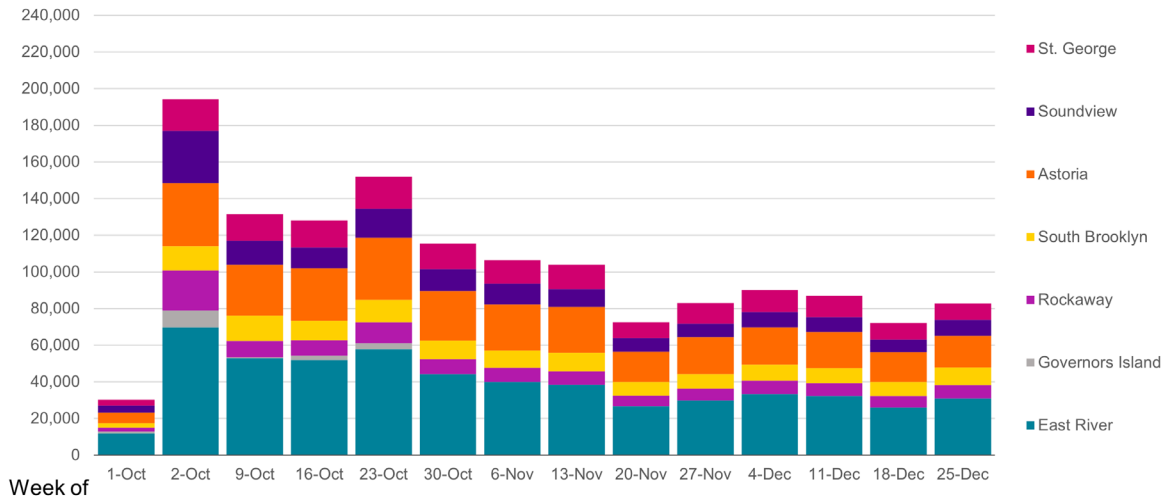

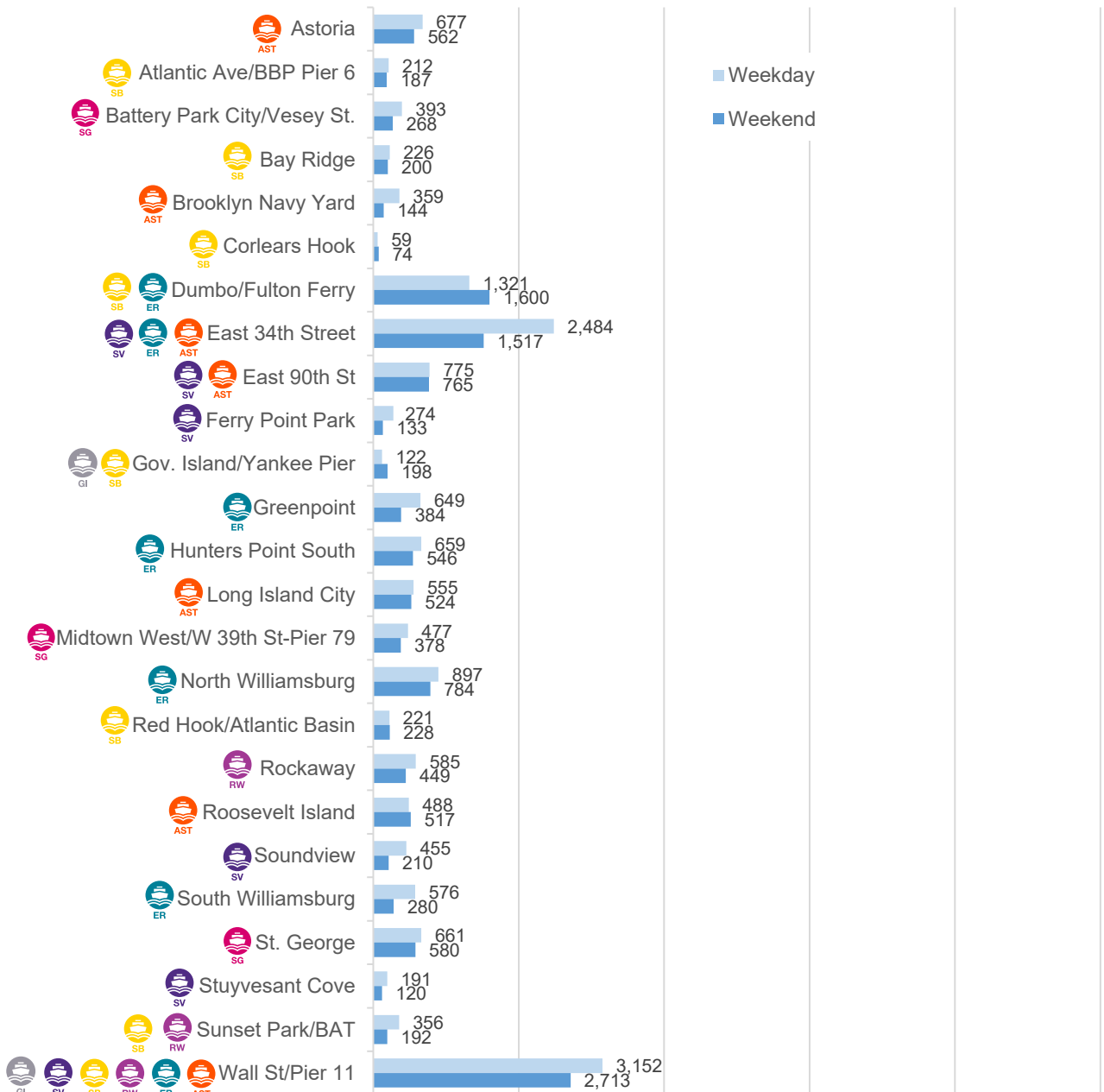

Highlights

NYC Ferry set a weekday ridership record on October 3rd with more than 38,000 riders. NYC Ferry set a new monthly record in October, November, and December, with more than 1.4M riders total in Q4.



Service Notes

NYC Ferry ran a modified schedule from 10/2-10/5 during the Sukkot Holiday. NYC Ferry operated a point-to-point shuttle between Red Hook/Atlantic Basin and Wall Street Pier 11 to accommodate a port of call at Brooklyn Cruise Terminal on 10/27.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops that departed no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes after their scheduled time. The calculation method for On Time Performance was updated for the 2023 Operating Agreement signed between the New York City Economic Development Corporation and Hornblower. This report does not include stops that were not recorded due to a connectivity issue or were delayed due to extreme weather/tidal conditions or U.S. Coast Guard restrictions.
